The 2020 Georgia General Assembly legislative session convened for the first legislative day on Monday, January 13th. The legislators set their calendar for the first 14 days of the session as follows:

Governor Kemp gave his State of the State address on Thursday morning laying out his vision for the State of Georgia.

A few highlights of Governor Kemp's budget:

- Calling for the state's public school teachers to receive raises next year of \$2,000
- Push this year for an overhaul of the state's adoption and foster care system, including a call to triple the tax incentive some adoptive parents now receive
- The Georgia House and Senate voted to force 'marketplace facilitators' — entities that use websites or apps to sell goods or services produced by others — to collect and remit sales taxes
- Signaling that his top priority includes cracking down on sex trafficking
- Backing legislation to bring an end to surprise billing for health care
