

A New Year, A New Legislative Term

The 2023 Legislative Session of the Georgia General Assembly kicked off January 9th with the ringing of the House and Senate chamber bells.

The National Championship game between the Georgia Bulldogs and the TCU Horned Frogs, sent legislators and lobbyists alike to So-Fi stadium in Los Angeles shortly after swearing in on Monday morning. The late night Georgia Bulldogs CFP National Championship win brought a new level of excitement to the Capitol mid-week.

Additionally, the annual Eggs and Issues breakfast hosted by the Georgia Chamber laid out legislative priorities and budgetary goals. Closing out the events of the week was the inauguration of Governor Brian Kemp, Lieutenant Governor Burt Jones, and the Constitutional Officers. Thursday evening, the Governor hosted the Inaugural Gala joined by musician, Luke Bryan.

For the first time, legislators set the full legislative calendar for the 40 legislative days of the session.

Governor Brian Kemp Inaugural Address

Governor Kemp gave his Inaugural Address at the Georgia State University Convocation Center on Thursday morning laying out his vision for the State of Georgia.

Some of the highlights of his address included:

- Continued workforce and economic development investment and \$2 billion in income and property tax rebates.
- Proposing a new \$2,000 pay raise for state employees and teachers.
- Fully fund public education again for Fiscal Year 2024.
- Proposed \$150 million one-time grants for school safety and security, learning loss, and for paraprofessionals becoming teachers.

House Leadership and Committee Chair's

Speaker Burns announced plans to **create a new healthcare committee that will oversee the existing healthcare committees that are responsible for health policy and funding.**

Representative Butch Parrish (R-Swainsboro), who currently chairs the Health Subcommittee of the House Appropriations Committee, will serve as chair of the new committee.

Speaker Burns also announced that the House's other committee assignments will be released next week.

At this point, we are awaiting details on how any and all health policy will operate at the legislature. We believe this will all be rolled out by Speakers Burns next week.

SB 1 - Sen. Greg Dolezal

COVID Vaccination Proof for Government Services - Seeks to remove the automatic repealer on the prohibition on state and local governments from requiring proof of COVID vaccination for government services

SB 2 - Sen. Greg Dolezal

COVID Liability - Seeks to provide certain immunities from liability claims regarding COVID-19.

Legislators and Constitutional Officers will be invited to attend the luncheon. We will be meeting with individual legislators throughout the morning hours on the House and Senate ropes.


